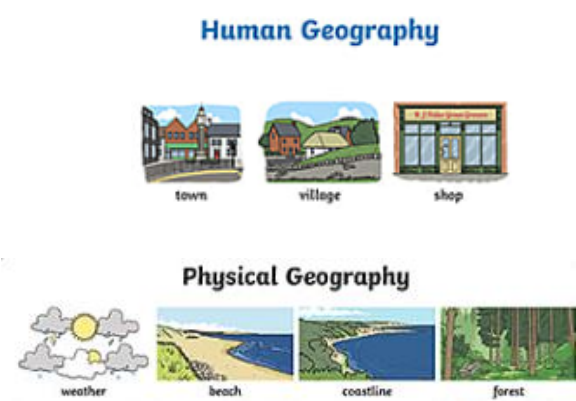

Vocabulary	
Human Features	Things that have been built by people. For example, houses, roads and bridges.
Physical Features	Things that have not been made by people and that are natural around the world. For example, seas, mountains and forests.
Birds Eye View	The view from above. It is the view a bird would have if it was looking down.
Map	Normally a picture of a place, usually drawn from above.
Weather	What the sky and air outside are like, such as cold and cloudy.
United Kingdom	It is made up of four parts: England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland.
